What about salaries, tax and health insurance?

Tax

You will be subject to withholding tax. This means that the tax will be deducted directly from your salary.

Salaries

There are no nationwide minimal wages in Switzerland. The cantons of Neuchâtel, Jura, Geneva, Ticino and Basel-Stadt have a statutory minimum wage (between CHF 19 - 23 / h, depending on the canton).

Health insurance

In Switzerland, health insurance is mandatory, but has nothing to do with the job. It is therefore not necessary for the application for a work permit. (With protection status S, you are included in the compulsory health insurance scheme).
